Winter Warmth /Outdoor Clothing fund – Deadline – Friday 16th April 2021 - Essex Early Years has been awarded funding from Central Government to provide warm or outdoor clothing for our FEEE2 and EYPP children and we are seeking your help to distribute vouchers to the eligible families registered to attend your setting.

Every child registered to attend your setting, that is in receipt of 2 year old Free Early Education Entitlement or Early Years Pupil Premium funding, is entitled to a voucher for £25 that can be spent in a range of local retailers. You may already have heard of this scheme as it has recently been rolled out through schools for children in receipt of free school meals.

Essex County Council has commissioned a company called Wonde to issue these vouchers. To access vouchers childcare providers, including childminders, with eligible children need to register on Wonde's a web-based portal, submit the number of eligible children you have registered at your setting. You will then be allocated a number of vouchers and validation codes that can be downloaded and passed directly to parents. The vouchers **MUST BE ALLOCATED by Friday 16th April** so time really is of the essence! Please note, parents are not required to have spent the voucher by this date.

We recognise that this is an additional administrative task for you all. We were hoping to be able to contact all eligible families ourselves and not pass this onto to you as the childcare providers, however, we have been advised that to do so would mean that we are in breach of Data Protection guidelines, as the permissions we have from parents to use their data would not cover this type of contact. We also recognise what a huge help £25 to spend on a new coat or a pair of wellies and a warm jumper will be for many parents and we know that you will want to support if you are able.

Although this funding is primarily targeted at FEEE2 and EYPP children, you may well have children in your setting that do not meet this criteria, however you know that the family are experiencing financial hardship and they would also really benefit from this additional support. If you do have children whose family are experiencing financial hardship, please include them in your submission and you will be allocated a voucher that you can pass straight on to their parents.

You should have received an email with the process your setting will need to undertake, however if you are yet to receive any correspondence please contact your relevant Children's Community Development Lead (CCDL) who will forward this information on to you via the following email addresses: -

Updated 29th March - guidance on shielding for staff and children, asymptomatic testing, Test and Trace payments for parents, parent and child groups: singing, educational visits and resuming Ofsted visits.

Updated 31st **March** - Converted the 'Actions for early years and childcare providers during the coronavirus (COVID-19) outbreak' from PDF to HTML. This version has been updated to reflect the DHSC announcement that a confirmatory PCR test is required following a positive LFD test result in England

Early years foundation stage (EYFS) statutory framework

Updated 31st March - Added a new statutory framework for the early years foundation stage which applies from 1 September 2021. Until then, the current framework applies. A **summary of amendments to the safety and welfare requirements in the EYFS can be found** <u>here</u>.

Two new vodcasts have been produced giving the latest information on the revised EYFS in one place.

• The <u>first vodcast</u> is aimed at headteachers, senior leadership and governors, and includes presentations and a Q&A from DfE and Ofsted as well as an interview with Clare Lishman, Director of Early Years at the Northumberland Church of England Academy Trust, about her experiences as a senior leader during the early adopter year.

• The <u>second vodcast</u> is aimed at Private, Voluntary and Independent settings (PVIs) and childminders and includes presentations from DfE, Dr Julian Grenier and Ofsted as well as an interview with Vicky Dewar, Nursery Teacher at the Northumberland Church of England Academy Trust, about her experiences of the early adopter year.
